Dear Friends and Supporters,

2024 was an extraordinary year for the Helen Kate Furness Free Library by every measure. Thanks to the incredible generosity of our friends, neighbors, and donors near and far, we surpassed all previous fundraising records—a truly remarkable achievement for a library that has been serving the community for over a century! We couldn't have done it without your heartfelt support, and we are beyond grateful.

One of our most impactful building projects this year was completing a "green" lighting audit in partnership with PECO. By replacing our outdated fixtures with **energy-efficient LED lighting**, we have significantly reduced our energy footprint, saved on long-term costs, and brightened our space. This much-needed upgrade came at the perfect time, allowing us to maximize PECO rebates and make the most of every dollar.

Another highlight of the year was our participation in the first-ever Delco Gives Day. Joining over 280 worthy nonprofits in Delaware County, we proudly finished **1st among nonprofits of our size** and 5th in total number of donors! Your generosity helped us raise **\$32,995,** unlocking **\$7,277 in bonus funds**—an incredible boost for our mission.

Additionally, our **Annual Appeal** was a resounding success, raising **\$107,434** thanks to your unwavering support. Unlike many other libraries that rely more heavily on state and federal funding, we depend on our community's generosity to keep our library thriving. We know we ask often, and time and again, you come through for us. Thank you!

This year, we were thrilled to launch our **Library of Things**, a collection of over **80 unique and useful items** already borrowed over 547 times. From tools and board games to crafting supplies and tech gadgets, our Library of Things helps patrons access resources they need without the expense of purchasing them, while fostering sustainability through shared-use.

Our programs for all ages also flourished in 2024. We offered **319 programs** attended by **7,514 people**, with something for everyone. Children delighted in storytimes, STEM camp, and art classes. Teens participated in a murder mystery event, a self-defense class, and sound meditation workshops. Adults engaged in book discussions, author talks, craft workshops, and fascinating lectures on topics like mushroom foraging and cave exploration.

Beyond fundraising, we've continued much-needed repairs to our historic building, including roof repairs in 2024. Looking ahead, we're excited to bring some essential yet exciting upgrades to the **Children's Library in 2025**.

We are so proud to have you as part of our library community. Our library wouldn't be the same without our wonderful patrons—you are the heart of everything we do.




